R&I are on the rise

At the onset of 2022, I would like to share with you some striking figures about the progress made in Research and Innovation (R&I) at global level which were published in the latest UNESCO Science Report 2021 'The race against time for smarter development'. Among them, it is important to highlight the increases in global research spending (+19.2% between 2014 and 2018) and scientific publications (+ 21% between 2015 and 2019), and the fastest pace of growth in researchers coming from low-income countries (+36%) ever measured.

This is very good news as R&I are key levers for sustainable development. But, much progress still needs to be made as 80% of countries spend less than 1% of their GDP on R&D and researchers from low-income countries represent only 0.2% of the total researchers worldwide, knowing that the G20 countries represent 9/10th of researchers, research spending and scientific publications.

Despite the efforts made, there is still a gap in this area between the Northern and Southern icountries.
