

One Health landscape in Somalia

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One Health in Somalia

Somalia, where climate change exacerbates health issues such as zoonotic diseases, requires a comprehensive One Health (OH) approach due to its strong reliance on livestock. The country has established a National Level Technical Working Group and identified key zoonotic diseases. As a COHESA member, Somalia aims to enhance national coordination, strengthen OH research, and integrate OH principles into education. Amoud University, one of the nation's oldest educational institutions, plays a pivotal role in this endeavor by spearheading OH initiatives, has organized the country's first OH conference and launched a OH master's program, serving as the multiplier for COHESA in Somalia.

Activities implemented under COHESA

- · WP1 Understanding and furthering OH
- Recruitment and training of enumerators of OH baseline assessments
- The pretesting of interviews was conducted, and a feedback meeting happened.
- Implementation of OH baseline assessments will start next week.
- WP2 Promoting national and regional OH collaboration and governance
- Participating in all COHESA seminars and conferences since September 2023 by nominating Somali individuals.
- Attending online and physical country multiplier lead meetings.
- WP 3 Building the future OH workforce
- Conducted and coordinated a Somali higher education survey to identify OH-infused graduate and post-graduate courses.

- The Somalia OH workforce sensitization workshop will boost national OH Platforms by offering technical assistance (logistics, scientific guidance, communication, report writing).
- Organize pairing sessions for research institutes with policy-makers and journalists.
- Organize annual science cafés with journalists, government entities, education entities and research institutes.
- WP 3 Building the future OH workforce
 - Co-develop short courses on general OH for a range of students from school children to higher education, to professionals.
 - Capacitate secondary and tertiary education institutes to deliver OH long and short courses
- WP4 Delivering OH solutions
 - Capacitate research institutes to identify, develop, adapt and deliver OH solutions for OH Focal Topics.
